Gangs Training

This half day training is designed to equip professionals with the basic knowledge as to why people and families get drawn in to gangs whilst also studying the local landscape here in Croydon

The issue of youth gangs remains a concern across London and one that professionals from all disciplines find themselves coming in to contact with.

The training will look at the various processes embedded into Croydon Council's practice to support gang affected young people and families and develop insight into the wide range of multi-agency work being undertaken and the forums where gangs are discussed.

It will also incorporate common themes identified through key learning from SCRs and Audits

Learning outcomes:

- To understand the vulnerability factors which may lead a young person to join a gang.
- To have a broad understanding of gangs operating in Croydon.
- To identify the cross agency work around gangs and the various forums where they are discussed (MASE, MARAC, FAP, Missing Persons Panel, JAG).
- To be aware services currently supporting young people and professionals around gangs and the referral process for these.
