Safeguarding Children Level 3	<p>This one-day training multi-agency group training is based on the core competencies as outlined in the DfE Working Together to Safeguard Children 2017 and the London Child Protection Procedures 2015.</p> <p>** Note this is not the Designated Safeguarding Leads training **</p>	<p>For all professionals and volunteers working regularly, directly and intensely with children and families</p>
Working Together in Core Groups and Child Protection Conferences	<p>This course will help you understand the purpose, function and professional contribution to child protection conferences and Child in Need Core Group Meetings and how Strengthening Families Framework model is applied in Croydon.</p> <p>This is one-day training</p>	<p>For all professionals likely to be involved in Child in Need Core Group Meetings and Child Protection Conferences</p>
Child Neglect Training	<p>Child neglect has featured in a high proportion of local and national Serious Case Reviews. Being able to recognise neglect and providing a timely response can be challenging, but is essential to help safeguard and protect a child or young person who is experiencing neglect.</p> <p>This is one-day training.</p>	<p>For all professionals involved in social work and early help, and working directly and regularly and intensely with children and families (incl. school based staff, health etc)</p>
Graded Care Profile2 Awareness Sessions	<p>The NSPCC Graded Care Profile2 is a tool to help confidently identify and measure neglect. It can help identify parental strengths as well as concerns. This awareness session will help you to become familiar with why, when and how the tool is being used.</p> <p>*** Note this training will not equip you to use the GCP2 tool ***</p>	<p>This session is suitable for Managers, Child Protection and Safeguarding Leads and front line practitioners in MASH/Early Help, School DSL and Family Liaison roles and Health Safeguarding leads and advisors</p>
Domestic Awareness Training	<p>A number of local and national Serious Case Reviews highlight domestic abuse has being a factor which impacted the safety and well-being of the child, especially when other factors such as parental mental health and parental substance misuse were also issues. This half-day multi-agency training will help practitioners understand and identify domestic abuse, and explain the processes to assess and manage risk.</p> <p>This is half-day training</p>	<p>For all professionals and volunteers involved in social work and early help, and working directly and regularly and intensely with children and families (incl. school based staff, health etc)</p>

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Domestic Abuse – Understanding MARAC and Claire’s Law Briefings	<p>The course details how the Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC) works as a partnership to safeguard those at high risk from serious harm due to domestic abuse and how to effectively refer to MARAC. The Police will focus on the details of Claire’s Law (Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme) and how to effectively and safely use it.</p> <p>These are 90 minute briefings</p>	<p>For all professionals and volunteers involved in social work and early help, and working directly and regularly and intensely with children and families (incl. school based staff, health etc)</p>
Impact of Parental Mental Health on the Family	<p>Parental mental health issues were identified as a factor in a number of national and local Serious Case Reviews. Having an awareness of how a mental health problem can impact on parenting capacity is important in ensuring a child is adequately safeguarded.</p> <p>This is half-day training</p>	<p>For all professionals and volunteers involved in social work and early help, and working directly and regularly and intensely with children and families (incl. adult based services)</p>
Impact of Parental Substance Misuse on the Family	<p>Parental substance misuse is often a key element in child safeguarding and child protection cases, as well as serious case reviews. It is therefore essential that practitioners are aware of how parental substance misuse can impact on a child's welfare and development.</p> <p>This is half-day training</p>	<p>For all professionals and volunteers involved in social work and early help, and working directly and regularly and intensely with children and families (incl. adult based services)</p>
Child Sexual Exploitation	<p>This course equips you with an understanding of child sexual exploitation (CSE) and gives you tools to respond effectively. Throughout the training you will be encouraged and supported to consider how your own practice can best address and support children and young people at risk or experiencing CSE.</p> <p>This is one-day training</p>	<p>For all professionals and volunteers involved in social work and early help, and working directly and regularly and intensely with children and families (incl. school based staff, health etc)</p>
Gangs Awareness	<p>The issue of youth gangs remains a concern across London and one that professionals from all disciplines find themselves coming in to contact with. The training will look at the various processes embedded into Croydon Council’s practice to support gang affected young people and families and develop insight into the wide range of multi-agency work being undertaken and the forums where gangs are discussed.
