

Helping to keep children safe



When out and about

1. Remember there are good and bad people - move away from those who are acting in ways that make you feel uncomfortable
2. Ensure a trusted adult knows where you are and when you will be back
3. Know your address and parent's or carer's telephone number
4. Uniformed people like police and Croydon workers in pink can help
5. Go to places you know are safe, with friends you know
6. Talk to people you trust if you are worried and be sure to tell them more than once if you are not heard
